PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING 2017-18

Introduction

The purpose of “Pupil Premium” is to address the current to underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals and their peers.

It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium is allocated since they are best placed to access what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils.

New measures have been included in the performance tables that capture the achievement of those pupils covered by Pupil Premium. From September 2012, schools and academies have been required to publish online information about how the Pupil Premium has been used.

Pupil’s eligibility for Pupil Premium is based on them meeting at least one of the following:

- Pupils who are in receipt of Free School Meals (FSM).
- Pupils who have been in receipt of Free School Meals at any point in the last 6 years (Ever 6).
- Pupils who have at least one parent serving in the British Armed Forces (Ever 4).
- Pupils who are in care from the Local Authority (Looked After Children).

Pupil Premium Allocations are:

- Free School Meals and Ever 6 £1,320
- British Armed Forces Ever 4 £ 300

- Looked After Children £1,900

2017-18 Allocation

Wood Lane has this year been allocated **£40,920** which has been prioritised are following:

- To those Free School Meal (FSM) pupils who are under achieving.
- To support funding to allow those children with under developed social skills to access sessional support.
- Providing support to individual or small groups for those children who need a boost to their learning in order to reach their potential, or who require “gaps” to be closed in their learning.
- Supporting pupils learning in the classroom with additional Teaching Assistants.
